During the annual orientation meetings for each campus in the weeks prior to the start of the school year, LFCS informs parents of LFCS' participation under Title I Part A, explains the requirements, invites parents to participate in the LFCS School Site Council, and notifies parents of their right to be involved. Written parent and family engagement policies are provided to parents in the yearly enrollment packets.

Written parent and family engagement policies are provided to parents in the yearly enrollment packets.

LFCS offers parent conferences, orientations, IEP meetings, DELAC meetings, general parent meetings, and LFCS School Site Council meetings in the mornings, during the school day, after school on minimum days, and in the evenings. While in person meetings are preferred, LFCS can accommodate remote access upon request. Translation services are provided as needed.

LFCS provides parents information regarding its programs under Title I Part A during orientation, back to school night, and parent conferences. Parent conferences occur at least twice per year. LFCS provides parents information regarding its curriculum and its assessment data during orientation, back to school night, and parent conferences. Parent conferences occur at least twice per year. Parents of LFCS students, have formal opportunities to formulate suggestions and to participate, as appropriate, in decisions relating to the education of their children during monthly board meetings, DELAC meetings, and LFCS School Site Council meetings. Parents may also communicate directly with teachers, site administrators and the school's executive director either in person, by phone, by email, or through a video conference if needed.

Parents and family members of children participating in Title I, Part A programs, if they find that the school's plan under ESSA Section 1114(b) is not satisfactory, may submit comments to any site administrator through the office staff at each site or at any parent conference, general parent meeting, IEP meeting, DELAC meeting, or LFCS School Site Council meeting and LFCS will include the comments with the plan. LFCS is its own LEA.

LFCS provides parents information regarding its programs and requirements under Title I Part A, state academic standards, its curriculum, state and local assessments, how to monitor a child's progress, and how to work with educators to improve the achievement of their children during orientation, back to school night, open house, parent connection meetings, and parent conferences. Parent conferences occur at least twice per year. Parents may schedule a meeting with a teacher or administrator outside of the parent conference schedule by contacting the teacher or site administrator.

b) The school provides materials and training to help parents work with their children to improve their children's achievement, as appropriate, to foster parental involvement. (20 U.S.C. § 6318[e][2])

LFCS provides materials and training to help parents work with their children to improve their children's achievement, and as appropriate, to foster parental involvement during orientation, back to school night, open house, parent connection meetings, and parent conferences. Parent conferences occur at least twice per year. Parents may schedule a meeting with a teacher or administrator outside of the parent conference schedule by contacting the teacher or site administrator.

c) The school educates teachers, specialized instructional support personnel, principals, and other school leaders, and other staff, with the assistance of parents, in the value and utility of contributions of parents, and in how to reach out to, communicate with, and work with parents as equal partners, implement and coordinate parent programs, and build ties between parents and the school. - d) The value and utility of parent involvement is part of our charter. This is communicated to teachers, specialized instructional support personnel, administrators, and other staff during staff training week each August. Administration and lead teachers train other staff on how to effectively communicate with parents and involve parents in the education of their children. The school's PTLC (Parent Team Leader Council) provides a means for parents to build ties between parents and the school through sponsoring events on campus and fundraisers. Orientation meetings, back to school night, parent connection meetings, DELAC, the LFCS School Site Council, and parent conferences are other opportunities for parents to build ties to the school and meaningfully participate in the education of their children. The school provides opportunities for parents to volunteer on campus.
- e) The school, to the extent feasible and appropriate, coordinates and integrates parent involvement programs and activities with other federal, state, and local programs, including public preschool programs, and conducts other activities, such as parent resource centers, that encourage and support parents in more fully participating in the education of their children. Parent and family engagement is mandated by our charter, including parent conferences, orientations, back to school night, open house, and parent volunteers. Parents participate on the LFCS Board of Trustees, serve on the LFCS DELAC, the LFCS Parent Team Leader Council, on the

LFCS School Site Council, and on the Patriot Legacy Education Foundation (a separate organization which fundraises for LFCS). Parents volunteer on campus, in the library for example.

The school provides translation services to parents during IEP meetings and parent conferences and translates documents into Arabic and Spanish to the extent practicable. Spanish and Arabic speaking staff are located at every campus to meet daily translation needs.

In carrying out the parent and family engagement requirements of Title I Part A, LFCS provides translation services during IEP meetings, parent conferences, and upon request. Documents are translated into Arabic and Spanish. Arabic and Spanish speaking staff are available at each campus to meet daily translation needs. Meetings and school events are held at locations that meet ADA requirements.
